How Do I Qualify?

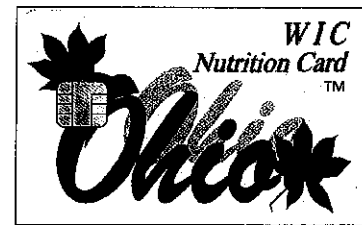
- Meet WIC Income Guidelines. Many WIC participants are employed yet are still able to qualify. A family of four can make up to \$44,955 and still receive WIC.
- Receiving SNAP or Medicaid automatically qualifies a family for WIC.
- Be at nutritional risk.
- Be pregnant, recently had a baby, breastfeeding, or have children up to 5 years old.

What Does WIC Provide?

- WIC provides supplemental foods like milk, fresh fruits and vegetables, whole grains, juice, eggs, cereal, peanut butter, dried and canned beans, baby food, and infant formula.
- Nutrition Education.
- Breastfeeding Support.
- Referrals for Health Care and Social Service Agencies.
